However, case finding is low and there is underreporting (report from Dece Mary, Provincial Health Office).</li> <li>Rotary Global Grant application submitted in end June 2020 for stratification / mapping training, 10,000 LLINs and 15,000 RDTs.</li> <li>Positive feedback from TRF with questions from TRF - compiling responses now</li> <li>It is important that RAM focus on border malaria elimination in West Timor (Indonesia).</li> <li>Issues:</li> <li>Import of LLINs and RDTs complex processes.
