TRF Regional Grant Manager has approved the training plan and budget for community health volunteers (CHVs) and malaria officers, to prevent re-establishment of malaria in two border area municipalities (Bobonaro and Covalima). Issue: Approved by TRF, Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) were purchased in Darwin for the Timor Leste's National Malaria Program but unable to send until Air North planes resume services between Darwin and Dili. (ii) Rotary Global Grant application for Timor Leste submitted in 2020 for USD107,000 for use in 2022 and 2023 – close to receiving approval from TRF.	Progress made – training plan being developed.
